

2 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi^[a] from the east came to Jerusalem ² and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

³ When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴ When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵ "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

6 "'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.' [b]"

⁷ Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him."

MESSAGE NOTES – Epiphany Sunday (1/5/2025)

Christian To The Core – Week # 1: The Core (Isaiah 43:14-21 & Matthew 2:1-12)

"'After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." [Matthew 2:1-2]

The wise men or Magi demonstrate for us what our purpose should be – we must be constantly seek to be in the presence of Jesus so that we may worship Him.

When we say something or someone is **ROTTEN TO THE CORE**, it means that thing or person is thoroughly bad and there is nothing good or beneficial in them.

Becoming a **CHRISTIAN TO THE CORE** is not something that happens by accident but takes intentional strategic steps to embrace the transformation that only the Spirit can bring about in our lives.

What is the single most important factor impacting the acceleration of the spread of the Gospel? The answer to the question by International Leadership Institute (ILI) research and study of the life of great Christian leaders was **LEADERSHIP** empowered by the Holy Spirit.

What are the qualities of Christian leaders who are changing history?

The best Christian leaders live by Eight Core Values that affect who they are and everything they do. The values are:

Intimacy with God - Passion for the Harvest - Visionary Leadership - Culturally Relevant Evangelism - Multiplication of Leaders - Family Priority - Faithful Stewardship - Integrity.

THE EIGHT CORE VALUES are essential for effective Christian leadership and discipleship.

INTIMACY WITH GOD - God looks for consecrated men and women who lead from an intimate relationship with God.

PASSION FOR THE HARVEST - God looks for men and women who share a passion for those without Christ.

VISIONARY LEADERSHIP - God looks for men and women who are biblically committed to cast vision, set goals, mobilize the Body of Christ, and overcome obstacles in order to reach the nations for Christ.

CULTURALLY RELEVANT EVANGELISM - God looks for men and women who live and teach the Gospel with cultural relevance, sensitivity, and power, so that the eternal truth of the Gospel will be understood and received in every culture of the world.

MULTIPLICATION OF LEADERS - God looks for men and women who disciple, coach, and mentor other leaders who in turn become leaders of leaders who effectively train others.

FAMILY PRIORITY - God looks for men and women who are convinced that the family is God's building block for society and who make their families a priority in developing leaders.

FAITHFUL STEWARDSHIP - God looks for men and women who are faithful stewards of finances, time, and spiritual gifts in their personal lives and leadership with the result that people are reached with the Gospel.

INTEGRITY - God looks for men and women of integrity who live holy lives and who are accountable to God and to the Body of Christ.
